Seán has over 35 years' experience of programme and project design, implementation, and evaluation in development, empowerment and human rights projects. Domain specialties include *education at all levels, housing, access to information, sustainable livelihoods, media, rural development, and ICTs for development* mainly in Asia, Africa and Europe. He has led many global evaluations, sometimes heading multiple teams across continents; but also continues with short-term rapid assessments in areas of interest.

Clients include United Nations Development Programme (HQ, regional and country office levels, Regional Commissions), European Commission (several Directorates), Council of Europe, UN Specialised Agencies (e.g. IFAD, UNESCO, ITU), UN ESCAP, UNECA, international development and aid institutions (e.g. IDRC, DFID, World Bank, USAID, DW Akademie) and NGOs (e.g. Oxfam Novib, Free Press Unlimited, Transparency International, APC, WACC, DVV International, SIMlab). Assignments include project and programme design, surveys, evaluation, policy/regulation consulting, researching and writing handbooks, manuals, substantive reports.

He is expert in or very familiar with virtually all major approaches to evaluation and programme/project assessment; as Research Director of Nexus was involved in developing the software-assisted SPEAK (Strategic Planning Evaluation and Support System) which has been implemented across many multiple-project programmes in Ireland and elsewhere. He is also a recognised international expert in **Theory of Change**, and was appointed to the advisory Board of the *Centre for Theory of Change* in New York: <http://www.theoryofchange.org/about-us/theory-of-change-advisory-board/>

He continues to work in Ireland throughout his career, for NGOs, CBOs, and public entities across many areas, including media, children's services, travellers, refugees, and public services.

Seán has extensive direct experience of working with and participating in civil society organisations and NGOs from local to global level; and held various active roles during the UN's *World Summit for the Information Society* (2003, 2005) including as organiser and spokesperson for the successful *Communication Rights in the Information Society* (CRIS) campaign.

He has long been an advocate and practitioner of community media as a tool for change; and is founding Chairperson of *Dublin Community Television* ([www.dctv.ie](http://www.dctv.ie)), and producer/presenter of programmes, and before that of *Community Media Network*. He is an active member of the international *JustNet Coalition* which advocates for a more democratic and empowering internet governance <https://justnetcoalition.org/>.

He is the author/co-author of many books, chapters and articles, and producer of television programmes.
